Established in 1963, Older Americans Month is led by a federal agency, the <u>Administration</u> <u>for Community Living</u>. The ACL is dedicated to helping seniors and the disabled live in their communities. May has been designated as a time to recognize older Americans' contributions and reaffirm commitments to serving them in our communities. This year's theme, "Powered by Connection," focuses on the profound impact that meaningful connections have on older adults' well-being and health.

There are many ways to stay connected. One of the best ways to connect and enrich your spirit is through the arts. Picking up an artistic hobby later in life can bring new-found joys and fulfillment. Do you think of the artist as a loner? In reality, that's hardly the case. Art in the real world is rarely an isolating experience. Artists collaborate, inspire, and connect. Advocating for Yourself or a Loved One in the Hospital

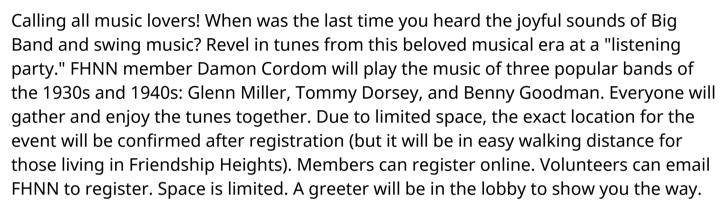

<u>Arts for the Aging</u> is a great resource for caregivers to help their care partners of diverse abilities and backgrounds enrich their lives through the arts.

Crafts & Chat is an FHNN affiliate group that encourages creativity and connection. It is open to everyone in the neighborhood and meets the third Thursday of each month from 3:00-4:30 pm in Willard Towers. First-time attendees should register by emailing information.fhnn@gmail.com.

<u>Dance Exchange</u> in Takoma Park has several classes for older adults, including a <u>free online class</u> on Thursdays. Their "Dance On" program encourages creative aging in older adults. No prior dance experience is required.

Encore Creativity for Older Adults is the nation's largest and fastest-growing choral organization for older adults, with over 40 ensembles nationwide. Encore Creativity holds summer sessions, which last six weeks. Beginning the week of July 15, you can sing in one of two choral groups in person at the Rockville Senior Center on Wednesdays. Enjoy a classic repertoire with Encore Chorale from 12:30-2:00 pm or arrangements of rock and roll hits with Encore ROCKS from 3:30-5:00 pm. Programs are also offered online. Registration begins May 9 (\$75). More info and to register.

<u>Montgomery County Playhouse</u> is the County's oldest community theater group. They encourage auditions and involvement from people of all ages.

<u>Montgomery County Public Libraries (MCPL) Programs for Older Adults</u> offer various arts-related programs for seniors, including craft workshops, book clubs, and author talks.

Montgomery County Recreation Department Senior Programs offer a range of arts and crafts classes specifically designed for seniors. Download their <u>55 & Better catalog</u> for information on their classes for spring 2024.

<u>Roundhouse Theater</u> has ongoing improv classes for adults. You can learn improv in a series of classes (\$150) or take a \$5 Friday-night drop-in class.
